# JUBILEE PARK AND THE DOVECOT



We hope you have all enjoyed some of the improvements that Bruton Town Council has made over the last year at Jubilee Park. These improvements can take a while to progress and reach final results, and there is still more to come!

## DOVECOT BENCH

The most recent is the installation of the bench at the top of the Dovecot hill, perfectly positioned to enjoy the view over the town (hopefully with a bit of sunshine on the way now too!). The older benches below the Dovecot have also been refreshed with a repair and repaint, and signage around the park has also been renewed.



## JUBILEE PLAY AREA

It was lovely to see the Ladybirds Playgroup amongst the young people having fun with the newly installed zipwire. A large amount of tired equipment had to be removed, and the zip wire along with the new play panels have helped to fill this space; it seems a favourite spot after school. ## YOUTH SHELTER

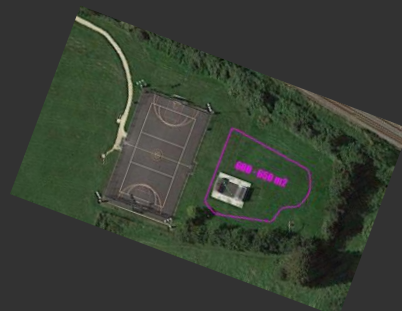
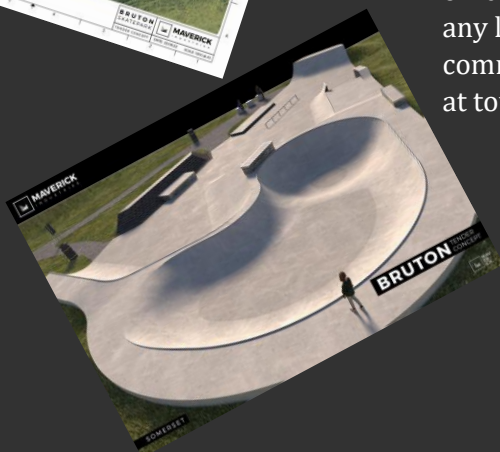

## BRUBOWL SKATE PARK NEWS UPDATE

Much progress has been made with c£90K of funds raised, an archaeological survey being conducted, and planning permission granted.

The application for £100k of National Lottery funding was not awarded, on the grounds that Bruton is considered a wealthy community, but this will not stop progress. The proactive and enthusiastic Brubowl working group and officers are seeking out alternative funding opportunities.
